Jos. H. Lowenstein, as a specialty chemical manufacturer in Brooklyn, NY, is seeking ways of improving the monitoring and control of our mixing processes and at the same time do power-intensive mixing work in the evening hours. By retrofitting the slipstream and optical analyzer system under a NYSERDA co-funded MAPS demonstration directed by ITAC to our mixing vessels, we will be able to detect mixing step abnormalities and endpoints. It should enable us to cut energy usage at minimal additional cost.

We understand that you are currently reviewing the viability of the next round of SBC funding that has helped fund MAPS and other NYSERDA programs. We see SBC funds as a very valuable resource to demonstrate and disseminate promising new energy savings and process control technologies to many companies throughout New York State.
