


One-Page Overview of New York State Energy Research and Development Authority Energy Efficiency Portfolio Standard White Paper, September 10, 2007

NYSERDA's White Paper incorporated two overarching ideas: NYSERDA sought to clarify how the Energy Efficiency Portfolio Standard (EPS) proceeding could be integrated with other clean energy initiatives, via a coordinated collaborative structure, to achieve the 15 by 15 goal, and NYSERDA presented descriptions of program areas that could be immediately implemented and made suggestions for longer term programs. Illustration 1 presents a schematic of the collaborative structure, which includes NYSERDA, the New York Power Authority, the Long Island Power Authority, the New York State Departments of Public Service, Environmental Conservation, and State, the Dormitory Authority, and other State agencies, utilities, and key stakeholders. The White Paper presented a governance structure for the Collaborative, guiding principles, a discussion of centralized service platforms — such as statewide marketing, data gathering, sharing, and reporting — and evaluation. While all of these elements of the White Paper affect the current proceeding, none are specifically on point. The elements on the left side of the graphic are representative of the current proceeding, and the contents of the White Paper that specifically affect the proceeding are discussed below.

The short (2008-2009) and longer-term programs outlined in the White Paper are comprehensive and would be implemented by NYSERDA and other members of the Collaborative. The focus of the White Paper was on inclusivity and collaboration to meet the State's goals.

The White Paper presented program areas with immediate impacts — 2008-2009 — and those with longer term impacts. Program areas with immediate impacts included:

- Research, Development, and Demonstration
- Combined Heat and Power Systems
- Technical Assistance

- Existing Multifamily Buildings and Retrocommissioning
- Commercial and Industrial Performance
- Commercial New Construction
- Direct Installation, Audits, and Rebates
- New York ENERGY STAR Labeled Homes
- Energy Efficiency Improvements for Single Family Homes and Workforce Development
- Low-income Services and Weatherization Assistance
